From our Interim Moderator

As I sit at my computer this slightly dull morning before heading off to Edinburgh for a Diabetes Tech Can't Wait Campaign Launch at the Scottish Parliament, I am conscious that we are nearly at Advent when we prepare for the big event of Christmas and what it really means. Where does all the time go? In the lead up to Christmas, we have quite a number of things taking place in our Kingussie and Laggan and Newtonmore Parishes as you will see in this newsletter.

For the first time since our minister Catherine Buchan left, we can be a little more certain that we will be given permission to seek a new minister. In a few weeks we hope to be able to hold separate congregational meetings to elect one joint Nomination Committee, representative of both congregations, to be given the job of searching for a new minister. I pray that you will seriously consider whether or not you would wish to be nominated. In due course we will hear from Presbytery how many are to be on this committee and the number from each congregation. There will be an intimation in church as to when the meeting will take place and how to put or have your name put forward. If there are more nominees than places, there will be a vote.

The Worship Group recently met and arranged services until the end of February and this list has been approved by the two Kirk Sessions. There will be quite a number of services around the Christmas weekend so you will not be spoiled for choice. You will be welcome to come to all or any as you wish.

I pray that together we will look forward to Christmas and feel and know what Christmas is really about, The celebration of the Birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Please take care and best wishes. Christine

PRESBYTERY PLAN

After months of discussion the Abernethy Presbytery Plan was finally agreed, and this will now continue into the new Highlands and Hebrides Presbytery until the next review. As it stands the Church authorities want Laggan Church to be sold and off their books by the end of 2024. There are a number of steps in the process, and these will take a few months. At some point, the local community will be consulted as to the future use, but in the meantime if numbers continue at a reasonable level, church services will continue to be held, though not necessarily every Sunday.

The approval of the plan means that Kingussie liked with Laggan and Newtonmore can now start the process to find a minister and recently voting rolls for the congregations have been finalised. A vacancy committee will be appointed shortly to take the search forward.

Christmas Day 10-30a.m. joint service in Kingussie



PROPERTY MATTERS

There is now a new fence between St Bride's and the Old Manse. It has taken years to get agreement on this and there is now an opportunity to tidy up our area at the back of the church, including tidying out the sheds we have. It is planned to have a Work Party on Saturday 9th December to advance this.

The roof of St Bride's has now had a once over and quite a bit of work has been required to repair damage caused by the weather and wear and tear.

The front steps have also had some attention to patch them up and make them safe.

An effort will also be made to tidy up aspects inside the church.

THE MANSE

Discussion is still taking place regarding the manse and whether we should keep it. The cost of bringing it up to the required standard is substantial and the current accommodation requirements for a minister, are now flexible and not cast in stone! Chris Mackay is preparing a discussion document to be considered by both Kingussie and Laggan and Newtonmore Kirk Sessions. Meanwhile an application has been made to Highland Council to see if there may be development options for the site.

FINANCE

It will shortly be the end of another year and a time to review the finances of our two congregations. It will be interesting to see how the finances work out for the year when we do not have as many services in each church. A fair bit has been spent making the manse wind and watertight and Kingussie have contributed their share to this expenditure. When a new minister is appointed, a special effort may be needed to comply with Church of Scotland requirements.

BADENOCH CHORALE

At the end of September, the Chorale held a very successful concert in Kingussie Parish Church when a varied programme of song and instrumental music was presented. Unfortunately, the usual Autumn coffee morning was not held due to a difficulty with dates. Currently the Chorale are preparing a selection of carols for the annual carol concert in St Bride's Church on Sunday 17th December 2023 at 7-00p.m.

PROPERTY CONVENER

We are very pleased that Chris Mackay has agreed to take up the role of Property Convener for Laggan and Newtonmore, and his commitment to the task is very welcome. Chris divides his time between Edinburgh and Newtonmore but following his recent retirement from legal practice, he will be spending more time here and his experience will be very welcome. He has been presented with a fairly lengthy 'to do' list!

ABERNETHY PRESBYTERY

As previously intimated the presbytery will cease to exist on 31st December 2023 when the new Highlands and Hebrides Presbytery takes over. The final meeting will be on 5th December when ex-members of presbytery will be invited to join in a celebration of communion with current members.

It will be sad to see the end of the local connections and friendships which have built up over the years and while some current members will continue on into the enlarged presbytery, church life will certainly not be the same and the decision to unite some 129 congregations into the new presbytery will undoubtedly have some growing pains and be subject to some scrutiny!

HIGHLANDS AND HEBRIDES PRESBYTERY

The new Presbytery Clerk Rev Rory Macleod from Skye took up his duties on 1st November and faces a challenge to get this new presbytery up and running. In the initial years the presbytery will receive a grant for central church funds, but the rest of the cost required to make the presbytery manageable, will need to come from presbytery dues levied on the congregations. At this time, it is difficult to envisage exactly what staff will be required, but finance and buildings will require paid staff. In the initial years, the dues that require to be levied should be acceptable but if inflation continues and congregational incomes diminish, it could be a different story. Currently, Roy Alexander is part of a small band of volunteers from different presbyteries assisting the Presbytery Clerk in drawing up a budget, certainly not an easy task!



KINGUSSIE NEWS

The organ continues to play well and is continuing to attract numbers following the Organ Facebook page a well as being appreciated by visitors to the church weekly open day.

On Thursday 7th December 2023 there will be a music event of Christmas Cheer. John Crombie will be playing Christmas music in the morning and in the afternoon, it will be provided by a Wind Group from Millburn Academy and others. 
The craft stall continues to provide a valuable source of items on behalf of the church including pens.
